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hen I was younger, I spent a lot of time on the Monterey peninsula in California, and that's just about 17 miles east of heaven. But after I was drafted by the Eagles, I came to Philadelphia and chose to stay. I fell in love with this city.

I was the first player in the NFL to kneel in the end zone—long before Tim Tebow. I'm always gratified when I watch a football game and see guys holding hands, praying. I'm honored to have been able to leave that legacy.

I've traveled all over the world, and there's no place like Philadelphia—the culture, the restaurants, the way people come together to work on challenges. Our People to People organization has a charter school. Eighty percent of the students qualify for federal lunch funding. The Vetri Foundation [founded by chef Marc Vetri and his partner Jeff Benjamin] is now serving healthy lunches there. We have Tune Up Philly, an after-school music program where all the instruments and training have been donated. We have an Early Childhood Development Center.

One of the reasons I shop at Boyds is that their tailors do such a good job. When I choose a suit, it's almost like having the suit custom-made because they make it fit exactly the way I want. You know, a person gets only one chance to make a good first impression, and Boyds helps me make the most of the oppportunity.

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
